

Quality Text- Dragons Love Tacos

In Paxton S we have been enjoying lots of new quality texts as part of our work in literacy. Last week the children fell in love with a very funny book called Dragons Love Tacos by Adam Rubin. This quality text is a picture book with wonderful art and was perfect for modelled reading. The story is about a boy who throws his new dragon friends a spicy salsa taco party. There is trouble when the boy accidentally feeds the dragons extra spicy salsa instead of mild salsa! In a very funny way, the story is very serious about warning kids not to feed dragons hot spicy salsa on their tacos. We used the book in many ways to support our writing. The children talked about their favourite parts in the story and we wrote our own stories about what happens to dragons when they eat spicy foods (their ears smoke and they breathe fire!) The children described tacos and dragons and sequenced the steps to make a taco and plan a taco party for dragons. We also threw a real taco party for dragons, where the children got to pretend to be dragons. They wore dragon masks, made their own tacos (without spicy salsa), listened and danced to real Mexican music.
